
A LAW TO REGULATE THE PASSING OF LAWS BY THE
BAND COUNCIL

The Council of the Sechelt Indian Band, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. This law may be cited for all purposes as the "PROCEDURE LAW NO. 1".
2. (1) Every law shall be read three times on three separate days.
(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a law may receive two or more readings at one meeting upon the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the members of the Band Council present at the meeting.
3. (1) Every law shall be read a first time upon the motion "..... that the (short title) law now be introduced and read a first time." The title and intended object of the law shall be given and the question shall be decided without amendment or debate.
(2) Second reading of the law shall consist of debate upon the general principles of the law.
(3) Every law shall be read a third time and may be passed upon the motion "..... that the (short title) law be now passed", provided that, upon request by any member of the Band Council, the whole or any part of the law shall again be read before the motion is put.
4. Every law passed shall be reconsidered not less than one clear day after it has received third reading upon the motion "..... that the (short title) law be now adopted", provided however that, if a law must be approved pursuant to any Act, it shall not be reconsidered until such approval has been obtained.
5. One copy of every adopted law signed by the Chief shall be kept among the records of the Band.

6. Any challenge to any law passed by the Band Council shall be heard before the Supreme Court of British Columbia, such challenge to be made within three (3) months of the adoption of the law.
