We appreciate your help and thank you for the cooperation that we received in the past years. Staff looks forward again, to a team effort to complete this year's Spring Cleanup.

The Public Works Department will be conducting the annual "Spring Clean-up" starting Monday April, 10th at the Bay View /Porpoise Bay subdivisions, Waterfront (upper and lower), Monkey Tree/Sunshine Coast Hwy, Tsawcome/Port Stalashen and finally to Garden Bay (SBL 19).

<u>Each house will only be stopped at only once</u>, so please ensure you have all your items placed curb side by April 9th. Public Works staff will not go back for a second trip to pick up late items, it's too expensive.

Please separate wood, appliances, paints, tires, yard waste, etc., into separate piles to insure your articles will be picked up. For the safety of the crew <u>"Please do not put Glass, Fluorescent Tubes or Bulbs"</u> in with your waste. Glass bottles and jars can be recycled at the Salish Soils Inc., Recycle Depot on Schetxwen Road.

Also for children's safety, please keep your children away from the trucks and equipment while the crew is picking your articles up. In the past work crews experienced children coming close to moving equipment causing serious concerns for their safety.

TSAWCOME AND PORT STALASHEN SBL # 1

Has a date for the Spring cleanup been decided?

Mission Road surface is very old and deteriorating, mainly due to heavy traffic. Suggest the area be inspected with a view to re-surfacing.

The area Speed bumps require re-painting.

The section of Titalshen, just South of Hupit experiences an annual problem of the large Cedar trees at this location shedding and covering the road with debris which becomes very slippery and a danger to walkers. Perhaps trimming of the lower branches could be considered.

Report for SIGD #23

Stustus Road remains a problem although a great deal of work has been done on the road in the past couple of months. The SIB crew delivered 4 metres of crushed rock at the end of January. Our new contractor, Shawn Glosslee graded the road on February 15. By March 1st, a mere 2 weeks later the road was again covered in pot holes and washboard.

The road will be graded once every three months but with a load of aggregate (gravel and clay) each time.

All this effort is greatly appreciated, and Peter has asked that I work more closely with him to try and stay ahead of the problem. Peter has mentioned that speeding digs up the road. Short of my running out to yell at speeders there is no getting around this. We all know the ineffectiveness of speed signs. Speed bumps may be the only solution.

I have sent out emails asking lessees to monitor their speed to preserve the state of the road. Unfortunately it doesn't help either. As well, the road seems to be sinking. (Built on a bog?)

There is still the issue of side trimming. Not certain who has been assigned to do this job? Last summer we did not receive any side trimming due to the ongoing high fire hazard. The side growth is already becoming a problem. We have one dangerously blind corner that will need to be addressed sooner than later.
