GRANT IN AID PROCEDURE

The shíshálh Nation Government District Council Contingency and Grant in Aid Policy provide the basis for the Grant in Aid Procedure.

As stated in the Policy, Council's Contingency budget covers incidental or unusual expenses that are not provided for elsewhere in the budget. This can include the provision of donations for funding requests that are received outside the Grant in Aid application timeline. The expenditure would be approved by resolution of Council.

Grant in Aid

- 1. The total Grant in Aid budget is set annually in the SNGD budget and five-year financial plan.
- 2. Council may determine a portion of the Grant in Aid budget to be directly awarded (application not required). The organization and amount of the Grant in Aid will be approved at the time the annual budget is approved.
- 3. The balance of the Grant in Aid budget requires an application which must be submitted by June 30th.
- 4. Eligible applications (see Council Contingency and Grant in Aid Policy) will be reviewed by a committee comprised of three members of the Advisory Council and a SNGD staff member.
- 5. The committee will recommend the organizations and amount of Grant in Aid to Council at the next Duly Convened meeting for approval (no later than August).
- 6. Applicant organizations will receive a letter announcing the success level of their request and, if awarded a grant, the amount awarded.
- 7. Receipt of an acknowledgement of the grant letter is required, and cheque requisitions will be processed for payment within a 3-week window of receipt.

 All organizations (including direct awards) receiving a Grant in Aid must provide a report on the use of funds by March 1st of the following year. If the organization does not submit a report they will not be eligible for another Grant in Aid.

Scoring

- Adjudicators read the applications and rate how well each applicant scores based on 5 criteria (Community Benefit, Volunteer Participation, Funding Source Variety, Board Participation and Fiscally Responsible, Community Co-ordination & Co-operation). Each category is worth 20%.
- 2. The individual scores are aggregated, and a final score determined.
- 3. Grant amounts are based on the final score an organization receives.
- 4. Organizations that fall below the 50% line will not be funded.
